TLT: What was the impetus behind this very special book of yours, *To Cancer*, with Love: My Journey of Joy?

TLT: Firstly, big congratulations on your inspiring life journey and for all the milestones that you have achieved. Well, can you please share your experiences as a Cancer Crusader with us!

Neelam Kumar: Thank you! While we struggle with one C—Corona, why do we forget the threat of the other C? Cancer? I have used the horror script of my life—early widowhood; single parenting; the unimaginable struggles; my encounters with Cancer (s) to live with courage, hope, and joy and infuse the world with positivity through my books and motivational talks. One person in India dies of cancer every 50 seconds. The number of cancer cases in India is predicted to double in the next 20 years. Yes, the truth is India is sitting on the verge of a cancer epidemic. And yet there is so much ignorance and lack of awareness about cancer.

Neelam Kumar: When Cancer struck a second time, I began looking for hope and joy to lift my spirit. Unfortunately, I found grimness everywhere—classic movies like "Anand" in which the silently suffering, sacrificing hero inevitably dies. In the three classics, I read "Tuesdays With Morrie" he dies; in "Grace and Grit" she dies: In "The Last Lecture" he dies. I had made up my mind that the rest of my life would be the best of my life. I wanted a happily-ever-after story for myself. Finding no happy book on Cancer in India, I decided to write one myself. That is how "To Cancer with Love-My Journey of Joy" was born. It was picked up by Hay house publishers and zoomed on to become a bestseller.

My book is about an alter ego-Carol, who emerges in my darkest moments to make me see life through her own lens of undiluted joy. Carol is witty, spunky, and a joyous adversity fighter. All I had to do after that was to follow my own script. Somewhere during the pain Chemotherapy, I became Carol herself-despite my bald head. My book "To Cancer with Love" by Neelam Kumar helped thousands of stricken. suffering, and their caregivers find hope. Very happy to share that the new edition of this book has just been released. Have you ordered your copy yet and dropped a review on Amazon to bring hope into the lives of the stricken and the suffering?

TLT: You have written 10 books in a stride of a few years only. So, what are some of the tips that you would give those authors, who want to stay long in the field and make it big like you?

Neelam Kumar: Be unrelenting in the pursuit of your craft. Make a difference through your words.

Neelam Kumar: The experience was a life-transforming Master class. I learned the art and science of writing a bestseller from the literary giant and hard taskmaster, Mr. Khushwant Singh himself. He had seen a spark of brilliance in the amateurish books I wrote before he made me the offer of co-authoring a book with him. I had just come back from the USA after topping my Master's in Journalism course. He punctured my ego every time I cribbed about the hard work he was putting me through. "America ke liye kafi kur liya, apne desh ke liye kya kiya? Kaisi writer hai tu?"That would quieten me down. I always felt I was working towards a bigger cause. With no Google to help me, I had to travel to each State of India to collect and translate hitherto unknown, untranslated literary gems in regional languages of India to make them accessible to English-speaking readers. I also did a lot of footwork to physically visit Sahitya Akademi, libraries, and unknown regional authors across the country.

Our book - our favourite Indian stories by Khushwant Singh and Neelam Kumar become a bestseller. In fact, it still is, long after Mr. Singh has passed away. What did I gain? The precious secret of writing bestsellers was finally revealed to me. I also received invaluable training from a litterateur of Mr. Khushwant Sigh's stature. I shall be ever grateful for that.

The Literature Today: Your book, "Rendezvous in Rehab," is a product of the work of real-life events and incidents. What led to the idea of writing "Rendezvous in Rehab"? Were there any events that inspired the work?

Sameen Rashid Khan: I have a major in Psychology and a very curious mind. As a student, I got the opportunity to be exposed to rehabilitation centers and something about the outside told me that there was a lot to those places on the inside as well. This combined with my ability to bring stories to life is what inspired me to get into the process of writing the book.



Questionnaires:

The Literature Today: I would like to begin by congratulating you on the publication of "Rendezvous in Rehab." How has the response to the book been so far?

Sameen Rashid Khan: Thank you very much. Rendezvous in Rehab is one work that I am most proud of the way it has turned out. The response has been amazing! A lot of people have reached out to tell me that they have been brought out from the darkness of ignorance after reading it. But the best feedback I've received so far is being able to inspire one of its protagonists to stand up for herself and fight for a better future.

The Literature Today: How easy or difficult was it for you to write and connect a contemporary subject with the learnings from the present world and also remain objective about them in "Rendezvous in Rehab"?

Sameen Rashid Khan: I think somewhere, seeing things from an objective perspective was instilled in me as a child and I am very grateful to my parents for that! At the same time, I have absorbed my education rather than just studying for the sake of it. This is how it becomes a little easy to remain objective and as for connecting my writing to contemporary subjects- that has always been my forte. If you look at my earlier writings, you'll see that they reflect the same.

The Literature Today: Through "Rendezvous in Rehab" you have tried to show a different side of human existence. Why do you think that this side has got less mention so far?

Sameen Rashid Khan: As human beings, we have the 'if it is not happening with me, it is not happening at all,' tendency in us. Also, we choose to remain ignorant of what instills uncertainty into our normal life. This, I believe is why we ourselves don't try nor do we encourage others to see the different faces of human existence.

The Literature Today: "Rendezvous in Rehab" shows the uniqueness of your style of writing. How is this book different from your previous books? Please share a little about them with the readers.

Sameen Rashid Khan: So, mental health has always been the core when it comes to my writing. But every story is unique and needs to be told in its own way. While my first book, 'The Aftermath' was a complete novel (a story that reflected the after-effects of suicide) it still had the contemporary mental health angle. My poetry collection, 'Mostly me' also reflected the journey of struggling with mental health issues in a society that doesn't attempt to understand it. However, for 'Rendezvous in Rehab' it took a different direction altogether. I realized post 'The Aftermath', that maybe reading a novel is too time-consuming for our fast-paced society. That is when I thought of using brevity to convey my message effectively and Rendezvous in Rehab was born.

The Literature Today: "Rendezvous in Rehab" shows the story of a different set of people. How would you categorize "Rendezvous in Rehab" as its appeal seems to be to a broad audience?

Sameen Rashid Khan: When I wrote the book, I knew that I was not targeting a certain section of the society. My target audience was each and every human on this planet. The stories are also about humans- different or alike, we are the same species and I think it's high time we move on from just knowing how much a person earns or how they're faring in their love life to actually knowing what makes a person who they are (i.e. their struggles). So, Rendezvous in Rehab can be categorized as, if I may say, "a source of awareness about our own species."

The Literature Today: "Rendezvous in Rehab" has given a powerful introduction to your potential as a writer. Can the readers expect more from you in the future? Please share about your future projects.

Sameen Rashid Khan: I'm really honored to hear that! As for my future projects, I assure my readers that I won't be disappointing them and that this is just the beginning. There's a lot more to come along the lines of mental health advocacy.

The Literature Today: You have chosen a title that is relevant and best suited. What is the story behind the creation of the title, "Rendezvous in Rehab"?

Sameen Rashid Khan: Well, I wanted to introduce the real face of rehabilitation centers in India to my readers and I played along with the phrase 'a day in rehab' until the very end. Finally, it struck me that a rendezvous is more structured than a random meeting and it fits perfectly well with the seriousness of the message that the book gives. That's how I ended up with the title.

The Literature Today: "Rendezvous in Rehab" shares stories which are born from your passion for imparting awareness about mental wellness. Do you have any other favorite writers or any which you read regularly? Sameen Rashid Khan: To be honest, when it comes to authors, I don't really have favourites. 

Reading and writing was his hobby. He started writing when he was in junior high school. Then he wrote Hindi poems, which got published in the local newspaper and school magazine.




Manav



Abstract - Badal Sircar, an Indian dramatist, is mainly famous for the presentation of his tragic vision of life in his play Evam Indrajit. Sircar reveals his thoughts through the characters of his play. The play contains the autobiographical elements and raises a question about the absurdity of man's life. Man lives his life with great expectations and aspirations without knowing his future. Sometimes his expectations and aspirations become the cause of his predicament but no one can deny that man is always helpless against destiny. Whatever happens to a man is predestined. Sircar concentrates on the theme of absurdity in his play Evam Indrajit. The term 'Absurd' denotes uncertainty of man's life. Sircar's characters struggle to gain something in life and try to find the meaning of life. At the end they found themselves where they were in the beginning of the play.

Introduction

Badal Sircar appeared on the surface of Indian theatre as a playwright who pioneered the concept of the Third Theatre. Although he began his literary career as a theatre actor and then turned into the field of direction and scriptwriting, his versatility was always visible to all. He is generally considered to be a dramatist who brought the concept of absurdity into Bengali theatre, but was only an imposed tag on his ability as an artist; it confined his multifaceted genius within a certain dimension.

The first play that made his appearance feel strongly on the stage was Evam Indrajit in 1963. It proved to be a landmark in the history of modern Indian theatre. This significant contribution of Sircar not only helped his recognition to flourish, but also improved the level of Indian theatre too. The thematic concern of the play Evam Indrajit is "the loneliness of the post-independence urban youth." in Culcutta. Through this play, he reflects the crisis of the complex situation of Indian middle-class people. Making the young generation the focal point of the play, Sircar depicted their passion as well as frustration in dealing with the imposed circumstances. While moving into the play in depth one comes across various characters, Manasi is a woman character along with Amal, Vimal, Kamal and Nirmal (Indrajit). All these characters show the complexities of modern life and the worthlessness of their existence.

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When Sircar was once questioned about the play Evam Indrajit in an interview that whether he reckon the play as a satire on contemporary politics and its worthlessness, replied to this, that the play is not an attack on politics and he was not aware of the existential philosophy. Though he expressed his not being aware the absurdity and existentialism, the effect of absurdist philosophy is very much felt in his play Evam Indrajit. The play reflects the point of meaninglessness when we come across the line, "nothing worth mentioning ever happens."(41) The play portrays a very apt picture of the complex condition of the prevalent attitudes and undefined crisis, running through the veins of the middle class urban youth of Indian society. The play moves around a woman named, Manasi who appears as an inspiration in the life of a playwright, who is struggling strenuously to write a play. The play reflects the inner complexities of the writer who is finding it's tough to write a play due to the honesty and integrity of his personality. The play beautifully deals with the life of the writer who finds life to be much more fragmentary that is why its transformation into the dramatic form is not possible. He feels that life is less natural and much more mechanical in the chaotic modern time and his attitude reflects the anxiety and agony of the artist who is a keen observer of the critical scenario of modern world life. Throughout the play, the protagonist is reflecting a journey that starts from the nothingness and ends up in nothingness- despair. This portrayal of hopelessness is a keynote of the absurdist philosophy

Absurdity of man's life in the play

The play deals with the writer's life and his agony to write a play but the vague feeling and the undefined hopelessness restrict his creativity to enhance itself. He finds himself not able to write as he has nothing to write about. He expresses his agony in the initial part of the play, he says: What shall I write? Who shall I write about? How many people do I know? And what do I know about them? I know nothing about the suffering masses. Nothing about the toiling peasants. Nothing about the sweating coal miners. Nothing about the snake-charmers, the tribal chieftains, or the boatmen. There is no beauty in the people around me, no splendour no substance. Only the undramatic material. (6)

The expression of the writer reflects his sterile approach toward life. He seems to have less knowledge and experience of the basic reality of life. He is also finding those people about whom he wants to write, undramatic who are sitting in the auditorium. At this point of the play, one can easily witness its closeness to absurdist philosophy and existentialism. The swift twist takes place in the play and out of a sudden the protagonist, the writer invites four persons from the audience named Amal, Vimal, Kamal and Nirmal but the writer was not agreed with the last name Nirmal. He says: No. It can't be. You must have another name. You have to have. Tell me truly, what's your name? (4) After the element of doubt rose by the writer about the name of the fourth person Nirmal, he finally confesses to have shied away from his real name. He reveals the fact that his real name is not Nirmal but Indrajit, the name of the mythical rebel, Meghnad who defeated Indra. Nirmal says that he called himself Nirmal because he was "scared of unrest. One invites unrest by breaking norms." (5)

Indrajit appears to be different to the other characters in the story as Amal, Vimal and Kamal have an approach toward life that is considered to be an appreciable way to survive. Such kinds of people are only concerned about their status and comfort in life. They don't crave the betterment of society or bring a drastic change in society. They are so much self-contained that they never peep into the crisis of the others. Sircar, while critically dealing with the absurdities of existence considers these people to be dead as they reflect the meaningless approach toward life. At the initial point of the play when the writer queries Indrajit about his being dead. Indrajit at this answered very absurdly as he says that he is in doubt whether he is dead or alive. The question that may come to the mind of any reader here is, why the writer is not keen to ask a similar question to the other characters. One of the reasons that will come to the reader's cognition is that the writer has already reckoned them as no more alive. The part of the interaction that took place here in the play shows the mastery of the handling of the technique of the dramatist. Such kind of innovative approach helps the Indian playwrights to re-structure the already set norms of dramatic technique. The play unfolds all the characters' lives and psychologies with the help of the interactions that take place among them.

Sircar through the portrayal of such characters against the world which is full of inhumanity focuses on the worthlessness of human existence. With help of these characters, Sircar defines a new aspect within the framework of the play, in which he not only focuses on the outer world of the characters but also their internal conflicts are also portrayed in the play. As an apt instance of postmodern Indian drama Evam Indrajit depicts the dilemma of the middle-class individual who is suffering for sustainable survival. The very title could be taken into consideration to reflect the fact that, how an individual is trapped in a chaotic situation. The title, Evam Indrajit is read as 'And Indrajit' in English, this attachment of the conjunction 'And' shows the relation of an individual to the society. While analyzing the title one can also understand that this relationship of the individual with society is not a natural but an imposed attachment. Indrajit is shown about society this also reflects the fact that he hasn't got his individuality as a human.

Sircar deliberately portrays the character like Indrajit to show the opposite nature of modern individuals living in an age which is full of self-centered nature. In comparison to the other characters, Indrajit is shown very differently. His approach toward life is entirely different from the pseudo-modern people. This is quite evident when he is seen resisting any part of exploitation. At one point in the play, the prevalent corruption of modern society becomes very much evident when all of them including Indrajit have to face an interview, though they all are aware of the fact that the recruitment process is all fake and the interviewers have already selected the candidate. This incident depicts the crisis of the youth of modern India where power matters more than talent.

The play also emphasizes a very vital aspect of the orthodox Indian middle-class society through the relationship of Indrajit and Manasi. Their relationship is not only questioned by the so-called ethical society but at the same time, they also question the orthodox nature of the society. Their relationship lacks ethics as she is his cousin. Indrajit showed an anti-traditional way to resolve the issue but his daring resistance could not sustain longer as Manasi didn't want to interrupt the norms established by the society. The portrayal of Indrajit's character reflects the middle-class individual trapped in the chaotic circumstances of the modern world. He assumes a name 'Nirmal' so the existing norms of the society would not be disturbed. His other name 'Indrajit' connects him with mythology. According to Ramayana, Indrajit was Ravan's son who used a covering of clouds to hide himself so that nobody can recognize him and this was the only reason why he was called Meghnad. Indrajit though didn't want to go against the established norms yet he has a sense of superior knowledge of existence. This becomes evident when he says to Manasi: "If I hadn't tasted the fruit of knowledge I could have gone on living in his paradise of your blessed society of rules. This statement shows that Indrajit realizes the futility of his knowledge. (23)

Conclusion

The end of the play questions the contemporary situation in which the modern individual's life is confined within a fixed dimension. Life appears to be more mechanical than natural. Sircar here through this play endeavours to suggest that even in such kind of situation there are people who can attempt to come out of such type of chaotic situation. The deliberate portrayal of characters like Indrajit and the Writer reflects the daring tendencies against the set norms of society.

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



As a mental health professional, the author shares the intricate details and thus, fulfills her responsibility of showing the world a broader picture. Through different stories, the author shows how life situations change in a short time and transform lives into what the characters or readers may not have imagined. The story "Age No Bar" is an example of this. It shows how a person's life can change even in the later stages.

Stories like "Starstruck" and "Beauty Restrained" show women as victims when they fit into the stereotypes about women. Aksara Bhagavad Gita is a book that rewrites rules of interpretation of any scripture based on the Gita and is in sync with contemporary branches of knowledge such as science, management, law, and Logic. Couched behind the narrated story is the new philosophy /paradigm/theory related to Srimad Bhagavad Gita, which the author seeks to share with the world at large. He uses this book as a medium to propound it. It touches on the four main areas of philosophy viz. ethics, epistemology, and metaphysics & hermeneutics.

About The Author - Ravindra Rao writes under the pen name Haribakth. He is an alumnus of Marathwada University, Aurangabad, India, with a Master's degree in commerce and a bachelor's degree in law. He graduated from Osmania University, Hyderabad. He served as an IT officer in a state-owned Bank and opted for 34 years before quitting service to pursue his passion, The Bhagavad Gita.

A self-confessed plagiarist who steals ideas from the Almighty's words collates it and analyses its import, and implications, and performs extrapolation before passing it off as his own. The adoption of Haribakth as his pen name is a reflection of his goal, but he has miles and miles to go before he sleeps. Life span, birth/births to go before the description befits him. He is the writer who has vowed not to write about anything other than Krishna, Gita, or things connected or related to Gita or Krishna. His works are a must-read for those looking for unconventional, unique, and unheard-of perspectives, which appeals to logic even if otherwise radical.

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EXISTING SCENARIO

Presently there are 5 main schools of thought offering their commentaries on the Srimad Bhagavad Gita. (Wikipedia)

- Bhedabheda (Simultaneously different and non-different),
- Dvaitādvaita (Dualistic non-dualism), founded by Nimbarka
- Advaita (Monistic)
- Vishishtadvaita (Qualified monism)
- Tattvavada (Dvaita)
- Suddhadvaita (purely non-dual), founded by Vallabha

Most of the commentaries are variants or a combination of variants of the above schools of thought. Plus, there are academic commentaries or non-Vedantic commentaries.

<u>ILL-EFFECTS OF MISINTERPRETATION OR ISOLATED INTERPRETATION.</u>

Each of the schools holds their version to be correct to the exclusion of other versions. Their conclusions are based on a semantic interpretation of words, especially of the word Brahman and its characteristics. Because Isms Create Schisms, God in His Gita, hasn't expressed or endorsed any ism, be it monism, dualism, qualified dualism, etc. Although His words support each of the interpretations.

AUTHOR'S FIX/PANACEA

To reconcile God's words with what He meant and disambiguate His words vis-à-vis His intentions and His supreme Will, the author has shifted emphasis away from semantic and syntax-based interpretation. To gauge what God meant when innumerable interpretations are possible, the author has bypassed complete dependence on semantics and emphasized the Characteristics of the Divine Author.

These are Omniscience, Omnipresence, Omnipotence, Independent, Defect-Free, and Possessing six opulences to the fullest measure, besides those narrated in the Gita by God Himself. The Gita being a product of the supreme would inherit the above characteristics as a legacy. So any interpretation which doesn't dilute the characteristics or which enhances the characteristics is what God meant and is true and acceptable argues the author.

Words convey different meanings. Understanding also differs from individual to individual depending on his stage of evolvement, conditioning, intellect, etc. God's discourse was meant to accommodate all persons however differently-abled/disabled they are and in whatever stage of evolvement. Words may be misunderstood, but not the will or intention. This is where this paradigm scores over other ism-based interpretations.



STRUCTURE:

The book has four sections with eight chapters in Book I, twenty-eight chapters in Book II, five chapters in Book III, and eleven illustrations in Book IV. This is followed by an epilogue and a message from the author. Book I gives an introduction and lays a foundation of the things to come. Chapters in Book II are taken up by putting forth propositions numbering eighteen and sixty-three supplementary or offshoot propositions and their substantiation. This substantiation takes the form of a debate wherein possible and probable objections are raised and countered successfully, thereby establishing the truth of the propositions put forth. Book III focuses on winding up the debate and effectively drawing conclusions. These conclusions are drawn by applying rules based on Science, Math, Law, Management, etc. Book IV presents eleven illustrations that simplify some of the abstract concepts, making the adage "A picture is worth a thousand words" come true. It also holds the author's message to the readers.

DESIGN:

The book is so designed that reading Chapter 2 titled "Parthasarathy's letter to his daughter and chapter 4 titled "Verdict form" gives the essence/gist of the core philosophy being propounded without having to read the entire book. Chapter 30 titled "Wiki-style Summary "does the same job. The dialectal form is used for presentation reviving the ancient traditions of the Socratic method or the divine Gita method. To make abstract concepts intelligible and to uphold possible objections to the new propositions a story is crafted around the narration in the form of a debate between two groups of students, with the author presenting his philosophy with 80+ propositions through the main protagonist, Haripriya assisted by Christina her friend. The author answers all the objections and misgivings that anyone may have by introducing the character Sudipta aka Trikali Gyani who opposes each proposition, creates doubts, and objects to anything not logical, not tenable, or against the spirit of the Gita, which are countered by the protagonist Haripriya, thus defending and strengthing the new paradigm.

IMPACT/EFFECTS

- •Moves away from creed-based, theology-dominated interpretation towards logic-based verifiable/experiential-based interpretation.
- It puts Gita and Indian theology-based hermeneutics in the center stage relegating Abrahamic religion's Bible-based hermeneutics to the background.


A Beautiful Heart


RIDING THE DEMON BY MURALI RAGHAVAN


