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Sanjeev Panackal Thomas

Sanjeev Panackal Thomas (SPT in short) won a Government of India merit scholarship to study at Lawrence School, Lovedale, known as the Eaton of Asia. It was far beyond what his parents could have afforded for an admission there, but the scholar in him did it.

Sanjeev was an athlete of repute, a sprinter doing commendably well. The Motto of the school, still reverberates in his thoughts, an approach to life called, "Never Give In". He was the Head Boy.

He went to complete his Mechanical Engineering from the University of Kerala and MBA from the School of Management Studies, CUSAT. He then did Executive MBA while working at the corporate. As a potential leadership candidate, he has received CEO Coaching from Switzerland.

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In a career spanning 25 years, Sanjeev has served on the boards of companies in India, Europe and the US. He was the owner representative of companies in Belgium, Norway and the US. He has turned an entrepreneur building companies in India and the UAE which are in incubation. AUTHOR INTERVIEWS

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TLT: Firstly, Congratulations on your book, "Karachi to Malabar" Well, can you please share your experience about making your work come into the form of a book?

Sanjeev Thomas: Thank you. The experience of creating

KTM#anodysseyoflove has been, in the simplest of terms an exhilarating journey. And in real terms, it's the work of a lifetime. It was a calling! Not in my wildest dreams had I thought I would turn into a writer. I have always been enamored by the eloquence of gifted writers. They create paintings, using words as colors to create a beautiful tapestry in all hues in a story. They are the born writers, who could take to penning stories like duck takes to water.

I was not one at all of that genre. Words just failed me. But, the adoration for writers grew in me to an obsession; to be among them. It's said passion can turn a tiny spec into a shining star. All you need is self-belief and perseverance. That's how the author in me was born.

Questionnaires:

TLT: What inspired you to write this book? What was the impetus behind this work of yours?

Sanjeev Thomas: Distinguished civil servant and author Dr Babu Paul was a good friend of my father. Over a cup of coffee, he asked me whether my father had penned his rich experiences for the next generation to know. He did start, but could not bring it to a decipherable form. Once he left, I thought why take to writing myself? Not his life, but a fiction that will have a tinge of his life. That way, it's mini autobiographical, stringing together the stories I have heard from my parents and my grandparents, still etched in me. I knew that my father had had a short stint in Karachi, the undivided India, where he had gone to visit his elder brother who was serving in the army. Piecing together, after due research, I thought "What if he had met a girl there, the handsome, eloquent, charming boy who cycled around Karachi discovering it; would they have had a thunderbolt moment?"

All fantasies! And that's how the seeds of KTM#anodyssseyoflove were sowed. 7 years, that's the time it took to bring it to fruition. The way you see it today.

TLT: You've given a very simple and composed title to your book, which gives a hint to the readers about the story in the book. What was the reason to keep it simple?

Sanjeev Thomas: Title of a book should draw you to explore it. It should retain the element of inquisitiveness to know more. It should give a sense of the ethos of the story. KARACHI to MALABAR, an Odyssey of Love; The title conveys, it is a love story, better put, a love saga with its deep desires, angst, and hope portrayed deeply.

It's the story of ZOHAL the Pashtun mountain girl who searches for her lover Michael, a boy from Travancore, who had to leave all of a sudden, without even having a chance to say goodbye. The core of the book is Zohal's search for her lover, her daughter's father. Spanning three generations across continents, the story weaves the sanguine magic of LOVE!

I always say, "This book is for those who still have residual love and romance within them" It will have an element of self for each reader through one or many of the characters etched. Interestingly, it's a romantic saga that you can start reading from any chapter. The flow still would remain seamless. The only caution is not to start with the last chapter as it would take away the element of excited expectation of 'the lover's meet'.

TLT: What was your mindset, while working on this book? Is it based on any particular experience of yours?

Sanjeev Thomas: As I said earlier, I was building on the stories that I had heard from my parents and grandfather. It has an element of me in one of the characters. No story intense can be made without personal experiences and events that strike a cord with you. Therefore yes, it's a whiff of breeze that cascades the experiences in life mingled with its fantasies.

Stories are never plucked out of thin air and written, however brilliant a writer you are. The novels of most accomplished authors, if you look at it, it's only a few that stand out. Then there is one which is ecstatic that touched his life the most., written from the depth of her throbbing heart. A calling, as I have experienced with my book, KARCHI TO MALABAR An Odyssey of Love.

TLT: What are some of the learnings that you gained from writing this book of yours?

Sanjeev Thomas: One realization was that each one of us has a writer within us. Do we strive to search and find or brush it away saying 'no way I can write', is the question we need to ask ourselves. Writing is not about flowery language. It's about the expression of one's thoughts, feelings, and the deepest of desires and dreams, in own words. The intent is important. Words will follow. But it's always desirable to have more and more words in your armory. The subtle differences in the choice of words can make the work magical. It helps you to transform the reader's journey in real-time. Each word, each sentence tracing an event elucidated in all its vividness.

I invested in my vocabulary a second time after school, in my fifties. I penned a book on mastering vocabulary through roots. Well, that was a gift I gave to myself, that enabled bringing forth this love saga, to you!

TLT: Next, I would want you to tell us about some of those writers, who had inspired you and whom you follow!

Sanjeev Thomas: Well, a tough question to answer as some of them may not be well known to all. For the well-known authors, Tagore still amazes me. The story just flows. The moment you start, it's a movie being played to you. As far as poetry is concerned, none can match Neruda, Pablo Neruda. He gave a whole new experience to poetry. The theme of writing in rhymes was given a pass. The poem flowed from the heart. His poems had the love, desire, and lust that embodied human life. The realm of magical realism was brought to me by two authors. The Nobel laureate, Marcus, and Malayalam's own O V Vijayan. His book 'The Legends of Khasak', I would rate it among the all-time enthralling literary creations in the world. Unfortunately, the native authors are shoved away with preference for the 'celebrities' of literature. I would urge the lovers of literature to fight for this cause.

TLT: Thank you so much for answering all my questions. All the very best to you for the future and your book too!

Sanjeev Thomas: It's been a pleasure interacting with you. I have had interviews, but such thought-provoking questions have been a Luxury. As you may know, the book has won the Golden Book award constituted by the Wings publication. It's been a rare honour and I thank the Jury. I would also like to thank Notion Press for being my publisher. And finally, a big thank you to all my readers, for without you, the book or the award would have never happened. I hope and wish that the reader community keeps growing. It's your support by way of reading, critiquing, sharing that challenge, and inspiring us to write more. 
TLT: "Antim: The Last Avatar" has given a powerful introduction to your potential as a writer. Can the readers expect more from you in the future? Please share about your future projects.
