

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

B hawana Somaaya's therapist had once asked her about her greatest fear, her instinctive response was the fear of not having a roof over her head. It reflects the layers of unspoken history. This single impression unlocked a deeper, inherited anxiety, a trauma born not just from personal experience but passed down through generations shaped by the wounds of displacement. In Farewell Karachi, Somaaya turns this realization into a tender, powerful narrative that spans a century and five generations, offering readers a deeply personal window into the painful realities of Partition.

Set against the backdrop of India's Partition in 1947, Farewell Karachi brings out the journey of a Gujarati family uprooted from Karachi, navigating exile and reinvention first in Kutch, and later in Bombay. Through a tone that is both mosaic and archaeological, Somaaya recollects her lost world that is lost to history yet alive in memory, a place of dreams, traditions, heartbreak, and survival.
